Ask: What's on my side?

- Facts/Truth/Science
- The vast majority of my community
- The Angels (Helping kids is just the right thing to do)



Ask: Who's on my side?

- Teachers/Librarians/Educators
- Pediatricians and Medical Professionals
- Mental Health Experts
- Former students
- LGBTQ Advocacy Organizations
- Co-workers and extended partner network (look around)
- My support circle (friends, family)



Ask: Who's on my side?

PARENTS

- More than 60% of Americans oppose banning LGBTQ+ lessons in school.
- 83% do not support banning books critical of U.S. History.
- 87% do not support banning books that discuss race.
- 64% believe transgender people should be protected from discrimination (willing to bet if you change people to kids and discrimination to bullying, that number is even higher).
- 80-90% support sexual health education in schools.



Some outside groups and politicians are willing to put kids at risk to score partisan points and gain political power.

We know kids are more important than politics.



Anatomy of a Disinfo Campaign

Goal: Political power

Strategy: Undermine public education

Tactics: Demoralize the workers,
Create chaos to obscure the strategy,
Flood the zone so the truth doesn't stand out



Anatomy of a Disinfo Campaign

Why use disinformation?

- Can't win with good-faith argument
- Can't support with facts
- If the truth is heard, it is believed
- Public Education is extremely popular.

Bottom line: You are powerful. The only way they win is if they make you stop telling the truth.



How to Keep it Productive

Don't Debate

Meet their Concern

Find Common Ground



Don't repeat the disinformation

Multiple studies have shown that factual statements like "these books are not pornographic" are actually counterproductive.

- We remember the disinfo
- We don't use our time talking about facts



Don't repeat the disinformation

Q. Are these lessons making white kids feel bad about themselves?

A. No. Kids need accurate U.S. history — the great parts and the not so great parts. It's about setting them up for success in the 21st century.



Don't ignore the disinformation

There is a lot of bad info out there.

The truth is outside groups and some politicians are heavily invested in confusing and scaring parents to score political points. But we think **our kids are more important than politics.**



Meet the concern.

We all want students to feel safe at school.

We all want our kids to have age appropriate material.

We all want our kids to talk to us about these issues.



Find Common Ground.

We all want students to be safe at school. That's why I support measures that protect them from bullying.

We all want our kids to have age appropriate material. *That's why* I support the sex ed curriculum approved by pediatricians and mental health professionals.
