

Congratulations on starting your TroubleNation group! We're so glad to have you! But now, what do you do? No worries, we have you covered – here are some steps you can take to get your group up and running.



Attend New Group Orientation by joining a <u>live session</u> held Fridays at noon ET or watching a <u>recorded training</u> – it's a quick and easy way to learn what you need to know to get started!



Download the Troublemaker's Guide and read through it. Some leaders like to print it out and keep it in a binder for easy access.



Decide how you want to communicate with your group and set up those channels. Our platform provides a great messaging board, but some leaders also prefer to build email lists or create Facebook groups.



Talk with other key members or leaders about your group's mission and what you want to accomplish as you build it up. You'll use this information later when you give your landing page a "glow up."



Determine roles and responsibilities - if you are the only leader, this may be easy but if you have a team of folks, decide what roles each of you will plan to take in order to divide the work and prevent burnout.



Decide on your first meeting date and location and plan to create a signup event on your group page. We can help you out with <u>Sample Agendas</u> and ideas for how to make that first meetup a success!



Ask everyone in the leadership to make a list of who they want to invite to join. Think about like-minded people in your area, folks you are in other groups with and even members of similar-missioned groups.



Give your group visibility. Every group starts as Unlisted, meaning your "dot" will not be visible from our map page. When you are ready to be visible to potential new members, click "manage" on the group page, scroll down and uncheck the box next to the words "unlisted group." Then click SAVE.

GIVE YOUR GROUP PAGE A GLOW UP!

Add your location to your group name or mission statement to show who you are and where you're making an impact! Make your page pop with photos, resources, and links for your members. This is your online home—make it unforgettable!

INVITE YOUR FRIENDS TO JOIN!

Now that your team has a list of folks to invite, get busy extending invitations! You can also ask the TroubleNation team to <u>send out an email</u> announcing your group to potential members in your geographic area. And don't forget to create an event for your first meetup!

JOIN THE CONVERSATION!

When you start a TroubleNation group, you automatically get invited to our Slack group for volunteers. This is where you can ask questions, share tips and get to know other TroubleNation leaders, as well as RWB staff.

GET TO KNOW YOUR RESOURCES!

One of the best things about TroubleNation is that we want you to succeed, so we provide everything we can think of to help you! Spend some time noodling around our <u>Resources Section</u>, because there's a lot to see. Whether you want to ask us for some help, or you want a refresher on the issues, this section has you covered.
