



Neo-Confederate Groups in the U.S., 2000-2024

The number of observed neo-Confederate groups active in the U.S. over time.



Today, the movement is a shadow of what it was during its peak, but the tactic of focusing on public policies around Confederate monuments, symbols and revisionist educational curricula has continued.



A broad variety of extremist groups and individuals, including neo-Nazis, antisemites, conspiracy theorists, Proud Boys, QAnon influencers and others, were operating openly on Telegram in 2024, spreading propaganda, recruiting new adherents and forming communities.



Disinformation & Antigovernment Mobilization

- Disinformation industry pushed “election integrity” lies
- Trump’s win deflated much election-related disinformation
- Militia movement decentralizing into “Modern Minutemen”



Local Militias & Extremist Legitimacy Campaigns

- Push to form official county militias
- Militia leaders aim to create division-sized forces
- Attempts to cloak extremism in patriotism and legality



Anti-DEI Efforts

- Mischaracterization of DEI
- Backlash rooted in white supremacist rhetoric and conspiracy theories
- Risk of DEI erosion



Attacks On Public Education And Inclusion

- Moms for Liberty's influence declined but remained active
- States pushed anti-LGBTQ+ & religious agendas in schools
- PragerU Kids curriculum adopted in 8+ states
- Over 10,000 books banned in 2023–2024

The hard right stoked fear of a “white genocide” in 2024, using white nationalist, anti-Black and anti-immigrant talking points and narratives.



Anti-Immigrant Activity

- Longtime anti-immigrant policy goals being enacted like repealing birthright citizenship, mass deportations, "re-migration"
- Extremist-tied figures tapped to help craft policy
- White nationalist-style ideas used to justify harsh immigration policies, stress test democracy



Turning Point USA (TPUSA)

Turning Point USA's primary strategy is sowing and exploiting fear that white Christian supremacy is under attack by nefarious actors, including immigrants, the LGBTQ+ community, and civil rights activists.





For TPUSA's narrow vision of womanhood, the single most important role women have is to submit to their husbands and serve in the home.


Male Supremacy

- In 2024, SPLC documented 16 active male supremacist hate groups, including 7 new groups
- Many of these groups reflect a rise in “alpha male” social media influencers who peddle pseudoscience, dangerous dating advice and predatory financial schemes

Just 24 hours after the 2024 election, posts using “your body, my choice” increased by 4,600% on X.



New TikTok and YouTube Shorts accounts are fed Manosphere content within 26 minutes of being online.

Young people exposed to misogynistic online content are twice as likely to believe there should be a more dominant person in a relationship and almost five times more likely to believe physically hurting someone is acceptable.
