



WHATIS MUTUAL AID?

Mutual aid and charity may seem similar, but they approach helping others in very different ways. Charity often works as a one-way system, where those with more resources give to those in need. Mutual aid is all about solidarity and community cooperation — everyone supports each other. Mutual aid addresses the root causes of inequality, while charity tends to only provide temporary solutions without addressing systemic issues.



WHITE SAVIOR COMPLEX

Assumption of superiority:

A belief that the white individual possesses superior knowledge, skills, or resources to help those in need.

• Disempowerment of local communities:


The actions of a "white savior" can inadvertently undermine the agency and capabilities of the very people they aim to assist.

• Reinforcement of harmful stereotypes:

It can perpetuate the idea of non-white communities as helpless and dependent, while casting the white individual as the heroic agent of change.

Self-serving motivations:

While ostensibly altruistic, the "savior" may be motivated by a desire to feel good about themselves or to gain recognition.



- These programs weren't just about providing services; they were about building power
- There's a lot we can learn from their strategy, their tactics, and their impact, especially for those of us organizing today in the face of rising authoritarianism

FREE BREAKFAST FOR CHILDREN

The Problem

Wide-spread hunger in Black communities impacting learning

The Solution

Free breakfast programs, feeding tens of thousands of kids every day in schools, churches and community centers

The Strategy

Meet an immediate need drawing attention to systemic neglect and providing moments of solidarity and empowerment

The Impact

Pressured the federal government to act and showed community solutions can be more effective than those by the state

FREE HEALTH CLINICS

The Problem

Poor access to healthcare in Black communities with systemic racism in medicine

The Solution

Free health clinics offering services from basic healthcare, sickle cell anemia testing and acupuncture

The Strategy

Collaboration with values-aligned medical professionals and combined services with education about health disparities

The Impact

Clinics saved lives, built trust, and exposed systemic failure



COMMUNITY PATROLS

The Problem

Rampant police brutality in Black communities with little accountability

The Solution

Organized arm patrols to monitor police activity and protect residents

The Strategy


Used California's open carry laws to make their presence known while educating people about their legal rights

The Impact

Patrols raised awareness and deterred police violence, but they also drew police scrutiny and reprisal from law enforcement




LESSONS LEARNED



- Build programs that address immediate needs
- Tie aid to advocacy
- Guard against state repression
- Empower communities, not just individuals
- Start small, but think big
- Prioritize security
- Leverage partnerships
- Build leadership from within
- Control the narrative

That's where local assistance can help. You're often in the best position to act quickly and provide aid or protection in your community.


