

### Potential Risk of Harm from Content Exposure

Extreme, inappropriate, and harmful content continues to be easily and widely accessible by children and adolescents. This can be spread through direct pushes, unwanted content exchanges, and algorithmic designs. In certain tragic cases, childhood deaths have been linked to suicide- and self-harm-related content and risk-taking challenges on social media platforms. 45, 46 This content may be especially risky for children and adolescents who are already experiencing mental health difficulties. 47 Despite social media providing a sense of community for some, a systematic review of more than two dozen studies found that some social media platforms show live depictions of self-harm acts like partial asphyxiation, leading to seizures, and cutting, leading to significant bleeding. 48 Further, these studies found that discussing or showing this content can normalize such behaviors, including through the formation of suicide pacts and posting of self-harm models for others to follow.

Social media may also perpetuate body dissatisfaction, disordered eating behaviors, social comparison, and low self-esteem, especially among adolescent girls. <sup>49, 50, 51, 52</sup> A synthesis of 20 studies demonstrated a significant relationship between social media use and body image concerns and eating disorders, with social comparison as a potential contributing factor. <sup>41</sup> Social comparison driven by social media is associated with body dissatisfaction, disordered eating, and depressive symptoms. <sup>53, 54, 55, 56</sup> When asked about the impact of social media on their body image, nearly half (46%) of adolescents aged 13–17 said social media makes them feel worse, 40% said it makes them feel neither better nor worse, and only 14% said it makes them feel better. <sup>57</sup>

Additionally, roughly two-thirds (64%) of adolescents are "often" or "sometimes exposed to hate-based content. 58 Among adolescent girls of color, one-third or more report exposure to racist content or language on social media platforms






# DISCIPLINE DISPARITIES

#### SCHOOL DISCIPLINE HAS DISPROPORTIONATE IMPACTS This report analyzes data on disparities in exclusionary discipline by race, ethnicity, poverty and economic disadvantage. ### Disparities in Access to Educational Opportunity: Students with Disabilities

Students with disabilities are disproportionately impacted by exclusionary discipline. While students with disabilities represented just 17% of Ohio students enrolled in public schools in 2022-2023, they represented almost 30% of out-of-school suspensions and expulsions. For students with disabilities to be adequately supported post-pandemic, it is critical that schools receive increased funding for students with disabilities.





Note: The rate of occurrences per student should not be interpreted as a percentage of students. Students who are suspended multiple times are counted twice in this measure.

Shameful: Gov. DeWine Signs HB 8, Which Will Make Schools Less Safe for LGBTQ+ Students Friedman said schools are responsible for giving students opportunities to access information, ideas, and different identities. Schools help young people learn about diversity and empathy when they read about characters who are different from them, he said.

"For many LGBTQ youth, in particular, books can be a lifeline," Friedman said. "If you are growing up in an unsafe home environment, often it is the public school where you might be able to find safety or affirmation of who you are."

LGBTQ+ young people are known to have difficulty finding safe spaces. Research shows <u>LGBTQ+</u> youth are five times more likely to die by suicide due to their inability to be out among family members and peers. In addition, 92% of transgender youth have attempted suicide before age 25.

These statistics are why Amanda Erickson, director of education and outreach at <u>Kaleidoscope</u>

<u>Youth Center</u>, said teaching about diverse identities and family structures is essential.
