

TELL **EVERYONE** YOU KNOW ABOUT THE **SAVE ACT!**



The SAVE Act is a massive attack on our right to vote, and could keep millions of Americans from voting. But the good news is, public pressure stopped this bill before — we can stop it again!

- The SAVE Act would make it harder for millions of Americans to register to vote by requiring physical proof of citizenship — like a **birth certificate** that matches the name you are registering with or **passport** — every time someone registers or updates their voter registration.
- That means if you changed your name after a marriage, but don't have a passport, this would affect you. Any time you move and need to update your voter registration, this would affect you.
- The bill would also require all voters — regardless of laws in their states — to provide a photo ID when voting and limits acceptable IDs to a short list that is stricter than voter ID laws in almost all states.

HERE'S WHAT THE BILL WOULD DO:

- **Make voter registration more complicated and inaccessible** by eliminating mail-in and online registration options, requiring in-person proof of citizenship for all registrations and updates.
- **Eliminate voter registration drives** and make it harder for community groups to help people register to vote.
- **Create unnecessary barriers** to voting for millions of eligible American voters, particularly those who lack the resources or access to required documents.
- **Forces all states to require voter ID to cast a ballot** — even in states that don't want to place this limitation on its voters.

WHO DOES THIS IMPACT?

Supporters claim the SAVE Act is about election security, but in reality, it will make voting harder for millions of Americans, including women whose married name doesn't match their birth certificate.

- **Trans people**
- **Military personnel**
- **Foster youth**

- **People with disabilities**

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

DOES THIS IMPACT ME IF I'M ALREADY REGISTERED TO VOTE?

Yes, it could. The SAVE Act affects voter registration and re-registration, meaning any updates to your voter information (like a change of address) could require you to present a birth certificate or passport in person. If you are already registered, and don't have any changes to make, your registration will not be affected. The photo ID requirement could impact you if you do not have one of the approved IDs to present when voting.

WHAT IF I HAVE A REAL ID? DOES THAT COUNT AS PROOF?

No, most REAL IDs do not meet the SAVE Act's requirements because they do not prove citizenship.

CAN I STILL VOTE IF I DON'T HAVE THE REQUIRED DOCUMENTS?

The SAVE Act would require all American citizens registering to vote or updating their registration information to present documentary proof of citizenship in person. If you're already registered to vote and don't need to update your information, you'll be able to vote without needing additional documentation. While you will not need to provide proof of citizenship to vote, the law does require voters to present a photo ID, even in states without voter ID laws.

WHAT YOU CAN DO TO STOP THE SAVE ACT

Spread the word. Share information about the SAVE Act with your community. Talk to your friends, family, and share on social media. Awareness is the first step to stopping this bill.

Engage with your community. Join local groups, events, or campaigns to oppose the SAVE Act.

Contact your representatives. Call, write, and email your senators to voice your opposition. Let them know that this bill is an attack on voting rights and must be stopped.
